

## Factiva

Factiva is an electronic news article service that is available to all ANU staff and students. It contains Newspaper articles, newswire reports and magazine features from a variety of international sources. It has a limit of three simultaneous users.

From the Library home page, click on the letter **E** underneath the **E-resources & databases** heading then click on the link to [Factiva \(incorporates Dow Jones and Reuters\)](#)



### NOTE:

Only three users may access Factiva simultaneously. If you cannot log in, try again later.

*To find articles from newspapers, journals, magazines, and newswire services:*

- Scroll down and enter terms in the **Free Text** box. Words and phrases can be joined using search operators.


To change or add terms, click on the **intelligent indexing** category and navigate to the terms (eg company, publication, subject country etc) to be included in the search. A single click on a term will highlight term in **pink** and **include** it in the Indexing box to

be added to the search. Double clicking will strikethrough the term and **exclude** it from the search.

Searches can be limited to a range of dates, and specific parts of articles (eg title, author etc).

### ***To view the latest headlines:***

Factiva lists the latest headlines from major newspapers around the world. To access these, click on the **News Pages** tab.
